This Gujarat Family tour package blends hands-on craft visits, village trails, festival-style cultural evenings at the Rann, and relaxed coastal time at Mandvi.

Day-by-Day Itinerary

Day

1

Arrival, Relaxation & Evening Heritage Walk in Ahmedabad

Arrive at Ahmedabad. Meet and transfer to your hotel. After check-in and a short rest, explore the Sabarmati Ashram (Gandhi Ashram) to understand modern India's independence roots. Enjoy an evening heritage walk around the old city lanes – Teen Darwaza, pol streets and the bustling Manek Chowk food lanes (timing permitting). Overnight in Ahmedabad.

Day

2

Heritage Drive: Adalaj Stepwell, Patan (Optional Rani ki Vav) & Transfer to Bhuj

After breakfast, visit the sculpted marvel of Adalaj Stepwell. Continue to Patan to see the UNESCO-recognised Rani ki Vav (optional stop; highly recommended for history buffs). Post-lunch, begin the scenic drive or take a short domestic flight to Bhuj. Evening at leisure – stroll local bazaars for handicrafts. Overnight in Bhuj.

Day

3

Bhuj Palaces, Museum & Local Crafts

Full day exploring Bhuj: visit the Aina Mahal (Mirror Palace) and Prag Mahal to glimpse Kutch royalty. Explore the Kutch Museum and stroll through Bhujodi – the artisan village famous for weaving and handloom. Meet local master weavers and see bandhani/block-print processes. Overnight in Bhuj.

Day

4

Village Craft Trail: Nirona, Ajrakh & Rogan Art Demonstrations

Today is dedicated to immersive craft experiences. Visit Nirona village to watch Rogan painting and traditional copperware, meet master artisans and see live demonstrations. Stop at Ajrakhpur to learn Ajrakh block printing and visit small workshops. Option to purchase bespoke textiles. Evening transfer towards Dhordo; arrive and check into your desert-style tent or resort. Carry a light jacket – nights in the Rann can be chilly. Overnight in Dhordo (Rann tent/resort).

Day

5

Great Rann Experience: Sunrise, Village Walks & Cultural Program

Early morning drive to the White Rann for a spectacular sunrise over the salt desert – a photography highlight of this Gujarat Family Retreat package. Return for breakfast and relax. Afternoon village walks and folk interactions; in the evening enjoy the iconic Rann cultural programme with folk music & dance, handicraft stalls and local cuisine under the stars. Festival season (Rann Utsav) guests should pre-book cultural show seating. Overnight in Dhordo.

Day

6

Kala Dungar (Black Hill), Dattatreya Temple & Drive to Mandvi

After breakfast, excursion to Kala Dungar (Black Hill) for panoramic views of the Rann and visit the Dattatreya Temple. Spot wild desert camels and tiny tribal hamlets. Later drive to coastal Mandvi. En route, observe rural life and shoreline approach. Evening visit to Vijay Vilas Palace (subject to opening times) and relax at Mandvi Beach. Overnight in Mandvi.

Day

7

Mandvi Leisure, Shipyard Visit & Return via Modhera Sun Temple

Morning at leisure on Mandvi Beach – optional water activities or a lazy beach walk for families. Visit the traditional shipbuilding yards to see wooden dhow-making. Post-lunch, drive back towards Ahmedabad with a stop at the sculptural marvel Modhera Sun Temple. Arrive Ahmedabad for final night. If visiting Rani ki Vav was skipped earlier, this is an opportunity to include it. Overnight in Ahmedabad.

Day

8

Departure: Final Shopping & Transfer

After breakfast and depending on your flight/train schedule, enjoy last-minute shopping for bandhani, block-printed textiles, or Kutch embroidery in Ahmedabad's markets. Transfer to Ahmedabad airport/railway station for onward journey. End of the Great Rann Cultural Immersion 7-Night Gujarat tour package.
