Day-by-Day Itinerary

Day

1

Arrival in Ajmer & First Darshan at Ajmer Sharif Dargah

Arrive in Ajmer (by rail/road/flight to nearest airport) and check in to your hotel. After freshening up, visit the legendary Ajmer Sharif Dargah for your first sacred darshan and participate in the evening qawwali/prayers if available. Later explore the historic Adhai Din Ka Jhonpra mosque and stroll the bazaars for devotional souvenirs.

Highlights: Evening darshan at Ajmer Sharif Dargah, sunset at Adhai Din Ka Jhonpra.

Travel note: Allow time for queues at the Dargah during festival periods.

Day

2

Ajmer: Temples, Forts & Quiet Reflection

Spend a calm day visiting religious and historic sites in Ajmer. Start with the ornate Nasiyan Jain Temple (Red Temple) with its gilded galleries. Visit Taragarh Fort for panoramic views of the town and later attend a local prayer or spiritual discourse if available. Enjoy a relaxed evening with optional Sufi or local devotional programs.

Highlights: Nasiyan Jain Temple, panoramic views from Taragarh Fort.

Tip: Carry a water bottle and wear comfortable shoes for the fort steps.

Day

3

Transfer to Pushkar & Evening Aarti at Pushkar Lake

After breakfast, drive a short distance to Pushkar—one of Rajasthan's most serene pilgrimage towns. Check-in and head straight to Pushkar Lake and the sacred Brahma Temple. Participate in the evening aarti at the ghats and walk the quiet lanes lined with shops selling religious items and handicrafts.

Highlights: Brahma Temple (one of the few in the world), evening aarti at Pushkar Lake.

Special note: The Brahma Temple has limited opening hours—plan visits early in the day for darshan.

Day

4

Pushkar Pilgrimage: Savitri Temple & Local Rituals

Climb (or drive partway) to the Savitri Temple on Ratnagiri Hill for panoramic views of Pushkar and spiritual serenity. Visit lesser-known temples around the lake, attend morning or evening rituals, and enjoy time at the ghats for contemplative walks. Explore the colorful markets for spiritual keepsakes.

Highlights: Sunrise views from Savitri Temple, meditative time at the Pushkar ghats.

Tip: Early morning is the best time for quiet darshan and photography.

Day

5

Drive to Jaipur — Arrival & Evening Temple Visits

Depart Pushkar after breakfast and drive to Jaipur, the Pink City. On arrival, check in and begin with visits to city temples such as Birla Mandir (Laxmi Narayan Temple) and Govind Dev Ji Temple for evening aarti. Enjoy a stroll through the old city lanes and a relaxed evening in Jaipur's cultural ambiance.

Highlights: Birla Mandir, evening darshan at Govind Dev Ji Temple.

Travel tip: Traffic in Jaipur can be busy—allow extra travel time during peak hours.

Day

6

Heritage & Temple Trail in Jaipur

Explore Jaipur's religious landmarks and historic sites. Begin with Amber Fort (includes a short temple visit inside the complex), then visit the spiritual Galtaji (Monkey Temple) set among sandstone hills—enjoy its natural springs and temple pools. Afternoon at leisure for markets or an optional visit to Iskcon Temple.

Highlights: Amber Fort, Galtaji Temple, natural springs and temple ponds.

Special note: Modest dress is recommended at all temples; carry a scarf/cover-up.

Day

7

Devotional Experiences & Cultural Immersion in Jaipur

A relaxed day focused on devotional experiences — attend morning prayers at Govind Dev Ji Temple, visit smaller sacred sites like Sawai Jai Singh's observatory (Jantar Mantar) for cultural context, and participate in an evening bhajan/kirtan if available. Enjoy a farewell Rajasthani devotional meal at the hotel or a local restaurant.

Highlights: Morning prayers at Govind Dev Ji, cultural visit to Jantar Mantar.

Tip: Confirm timings for temple rituals in advance to align your day with prayers.

Day

8

Departure from Jaipur

After breakfast, check out and proceed to Jaipur railway station/airport for onward travel. Depending on your departure time, you may squeeze in a quick visit or shopping in the bazaars for spiritual souvenirs.

Special note: If you need assistance with transfers or extended stay arrangements, inform us prior to checkout.
