Day-by-Day Itinerary

Day

1

Arrival at Port Blair & Evening: Cellular Jail Light & Sound

Arrive at Veer Savarkar International Airport / Port Blair Jetty. Transfer to hotel and relax. In the evening attend the iconic Cellular Jail Light & Sound Show that narrates India's freedom struggle. Tip: Carry a light jacket for the evening and arrive early for best seats.

Day

2

Baratang Island Day-Trip – Limestone Caves & Mud Volcano

Early morning departure for a full-day excursion to Baratang Island. Experience a scenic drive through tropical forests, a short boat transfer, the famous Limestone Caves, and the Mud Volcano. The route passes tribal reserve belts – note that interactions are restricted and must be respectful of local rules. Return to Port Blair by evening.

Day

3

Ferry to Havelock (Swaraj Dweep) & Sunset at Radhanagar Beach

After breakfast transfer to the ferry terminal and take the fast ferry to Havelock (Swaraj Dweep). Check in at the resort and unwind. Late afternoon visit Radhanagar Beach – voted among Asia's best beaches – for a spectacular sunset and beach stroll. Pro Tip: Book ferry tickets in advance during peak season.

Day

4

Elephant Beach – Snorkeling & Water Sports

Today enjoy water activities at Elephant Beach: snorkeling, glass-bottom boat rides, or a guided short trek. The coral gardens here are vivid and accessible by a short boat ride or trail. Optional: Certified scuba diving for certified divers (extra cost).

Day

5

Leisure & Island-Hopping Options around Havelock

Relaxed day on Havelock with optional island-hopping trips, kayaking through mangroves, or visiting Kalapathar Beach for photography and quieter sands. Enjoy local seafood and a sunset at the resort. Note: Many activities are seasonal – check availability.

Day

6

Transfer to Neil Island (Shaheed Dweep) – Bharatpur & Laxmanpur

Morning ferry to Neil Island (Shaheed Dweep). Visit Bharatpur Beach for gentle waters ideal for swimming and snorkeling, and head to Laxmanpur Beach for its famous sunset and natural rock formations. Evening at leisure exploring island villages and small temples – adding a gentle pilgrimage touch to the trip.

Day

7

Neil Island Exploration — Natural Rock Formations & Local Pilgrimage Stops

Explore Howrah Bridge (Natural Rock Bridge) and quiet coves, visit local shrines and small coastal temples for a cultural insight reflecting the Andaman Pilgrimage package aspect. Relaxed beach time and optional snorkeling in shallow reefs.

Day

8

Return to Port Blair — Corbyn's Cove & Local Sightseeing

Ferry back to Port Blair. On arrival, visit Corbyn's Cove Beach for a relaxed afternoon. Later explore the Anthropological Museum, Samudrika Marine Museum, and Chatham Saw Mill to understand island history and culture.

Day

9

North Bay & Ross Island — Marine Park Visit (Jolly Buoy if permitted)

Full-day marine excursion: glass-bottom boat or snorkeling around North Bay's coral beds and visit Ross Island to see colonial ruins and WWII relics. Subject to permissions and season, an optional boat trip to Jolly Buoy / Mahatma Gandhi Marine National Park for pristine coral viewing is available. Important: Jolly Buoy is open seasonally and requires permits.

Day

10

Departure from Port Blair — Final Shopping & Farewell

Morning at leisure for final shopping at Aberdeen Bazaar or a quick visit to local temples and churches depending on flight timing. Transfer to Port Blair Airport / Jetty for onward journey. We recommend keeping flight details flexible for ferry delays.
